## LYMAN No. 55 RECEIVER SIGHT



THE LYMAN No. 55 Receiver Sight, with aperture sighting disc, is designed to give the maximum "sight radius", thus decreasing the inaccuracy due to over or under shooting, as well as lateral variation, to which the shooter is liable when an open rear sight is used.

It is ruggedly and compactly designed to meet rigorous hunting requirements and is securely attached by two screws. Mounted on the left hand side of the receiver, the rear of the sight base is brought practically flush with the rear end of the receiver, giving the utmost distance between front and rear sights.

The No. 55 sight has close elevation adjustments and the slide can be instantly locked in any desired position. Lateral adjustment is obtained by releasing the slide set screw.

As an accurate target and hunting sight the No. 55 brings out the highest degree of accuracy in these ten different rifles listed on the first page and offers the shooter the following eight outstanding advantages:

## Features of the No. 55

- 1. Requires no cutting of the stock.
- 2. Securely mounted by two mounting screws.
- 3. Has quick, easy, graduated, adjustable features for windage and elevation.

- 4. Is furnished with special Lyman detachable disc with sand blasted face, eliminating light reflection.
- 5. Gives long distance between sights so essential for most accurate shooting results.
- Allows full freedom of bolt action, including quick removal of bolt.
- Location of sight at extreme rear of receiver is most convenient for all shooting positions.
- 8. Strong and rugged, holds perfect adjustment in use.

The graduations on the elevation and windage slide are .02" apart. These graduations indicate arbitrary adjustments, but are a valuable aid to the shooter in determining definite adjustments for his own particular gun.

The No. 55 is especially designed for each different make of rifle. On all No. 55 sights there is a locking knob on the elevation slide except the Lyman No. 55 made for the Winchester 59 and 60, in which case, the elevation will be locked by a lever.
